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## In the Classroom: El Dia de los Tres Reyes

On January 6, the Spanish 1 classes celebrated Three Kings Day or *El Día de los Tres Reyes*. Part feast, and part lesson, the students learned about the history of the holy day, and the traditions and activities in some Latino countries. Different



students dressed as the Three Wise Men and narrated a story from the book *Three Kings Day, a celebration at Christmastime* by Diane Hoyt-Goldsmith. Following this, the students had a discussion where they contrasted

the American Christmas traditions with those of people from Hispanic countries. While the students ate some refreshments, they had the opportunity to watch the video *Queridos Reyes Magos* which presents vividly the feast day in Puerto Rico. According to an essay by **Skye Johnson, Class of 2013**, "There are many activities that take place on 'El dia de los Reyes', including "*parranda*" which is singing from door to door until the owner of the house comes outside and offers them food and something to drink. And as for the kids, the night of January 5<sup>th</sup>, they put grass or a cup of water under their beds to feed the camels of the three Wisemen, metaphorically of course! But before any celebrations begin, many Catholics go to Mass because it is a Holy Day of Obligation."

## Epiphany Party and Collection



On January 5<sup>th</sup>, Pope John Paul the Great students took a break from their exams to celebrate the feast of the Epiphany with an Epiphany party. Students brought in baby items to be donated to St. Margaret of Cortona Transitional Residences, which provides temporary housing to homeless families previously staying at an emergency shelter.
